
Your Honor:

I am writing to you what I feel is a miscarriage of justice in the 12TH Circuit regarding the above mentioned case which is currently being tried in your court. Myself and other concerned residents of Trailer Estates are concerned about the ever mounting legal fees that are exceeding the legal budget by several hundred percent. We as senior citizens have limited resources to pay for this abuse of the elderly by the justice system and the legal community as we have reduced pensions in our current economic climate. Also when you allocate who is to pay for this miscarriage of justice, it should not be 95% plus great senior citizens of this park.
