In 1985 we formed a committee with the approval of the Board of Trustees to renovate the kitchen. With the help of Polly and Fred Hoerger we began putting a plan together. We served dinners every Wednesday evening from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. and called it "Kitchen Fixin".

We put together a menu, sold tickets at the Post Office, a lot of the residents donated desserts. It was a great thing and very rewarding for all the volunteers who helped.

There was nothing of much value in the kitchen – apartment size stove, small refrigerator, old sinks and a very old and worn out grill.

We purchased all new equipment as we made money. The sliding glass door refrigerator, new stove, ice machine, new sinks, exhaust system, electric grill, large mixer, freezer, pots and pans, etc.

What a great crew of volunteers we had and lasting memories as we worked in harmony and love.

I can recall what great crowds of people we had attend. One night we served Swiss steak and sold 441 tickets. I think the top price for a ticket was \$3.00.

Howard and I paid for the mixer and popcorn machine out of our pocket until donations and popcorn sales paid for them. We also went down to the hall every Wednesday and Sunday night during bingo and popped corn, made carmel corn, then cleaned the machine.

It took four months for donations to pay the \$1743.00 for the mixer. I have copies of all this for anyone to see.

We worked hard and were exhausted on Wednesday night, but never heard anyone complain. They just had smiles on their faces as each new piece of equipment arrived and was put into use.

Many of these people have passed away, but there are some who still live in the park and will remember what love and harmony for a job well done.

With the help of many more now doing "Cooks Night Out", Bingo Kitchen and donations we have purchased a new stove and two convection ovens. They are beautiful and can hardly wait to turn the on switch and put them to use. Equipment does wear out after 20 years and next will probably have to be a new ice machine. Thanks again Trailer Estates.

Flu Clinic



On Wednesday, November 14, 2007 from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., the Manatee Health Department will be here in the back of the large hall to administer influenza and pneumonia immunizations. The injections will be paid by Medicare. For those not on Medicare or those on an HMO the charge will be \$25.00 for influenza injections and \$35.00 for the pneumonia injections. The pneumonia injections are generally good for 10-12 years. If you have received the pneumonia vaccine within this time period it does not need to be repeated. The influenza injection must be done every year. You must sign up ahead of time in the office for us to have a count on how many injections they need to save for us. Last year we ended up giving injections to over 300 people, so we need this information for the Health Department.

While you are at the office take time to copy your Medicare card to be stapled to your immunization form the day of the clinic. Don't forget - **you must bring this copy of your Medicare card with you the day of the clinic. We also ask for your patience during the clinic.**

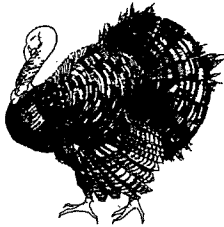
Men's Bible Class

Crime Watch

Crime Watch members met on Tuesday, September 25, 2007 in the large hall. New members were introduced. The report of criminal activity for the Month of September was given by Florris Bly, as follows:

September 7th - Nebraska St. - New bricks stolen, replaced with old ones.

September 12th - Minnesota Ave. - Motor home cable stolen.

September 23rd - New York Ave. - Home robbed.

September 26th - Michigan Ave. - Home broken into, 2 golf carts, large TV stolen.

These instances of criminal activity were reported to the TE office and Sheriff's office.

A report was made of a woman or women perpetrating a scam throughout the park, collecting money for bogus charitable causes. Residents were cautioned not to talk with anyone trying to solicit money for any purpose. Also, it was reported that there were some young boys in the park supposedly taking a survey for the Bradenton Herald, at the same time taking interest in vehicles parked in driveways in the area.

Deputy Dawn arrived just as the meeting was ending, and apologized for being late. She passed out refrigerator magnets to those present with a Manatee County Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention number on it, which is (941) 747-3011 Ext. 2500. This is a non-emergency number which can be used by "neighbors watching out for neighbors" who see anything suspicious, to report to the Sheriff's Department. The magnets also contain an e-mail address, which is: communitywatch@manateesheriff.com. E-mails using this address will be read promptly by employees of the Manatee County Sheriff's Department and acted upon as soon as possible. Deputies will be riding through neighborhood areas on bikes, and in marked and unmarked cars, in an effort to reduce criminal activity throughout Manatee County. But they need the eyes and ears of all residents to help them in these efforts, by reporting anything of a suspicious nature occurring in our neighborhood.

Our Crime Watch secretary, Beverly Ferguson, has announced that she must resign temporarily for personal reasons, for the winter months, but hopes to be available again in the spring. We are once again welcoming back our Snow Birds, and hope to have a large, active crime watch group once again this fall and winter. Just a reminder that our meetings are held on the 4th Tuesday of each month at 7:15 a.m. in the south end of the large hall.

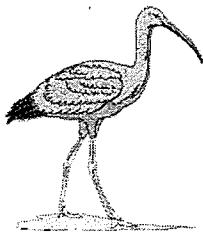
Let's Talk Club

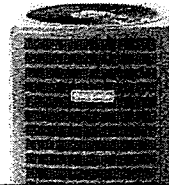

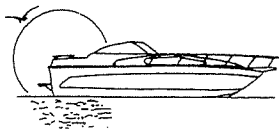
The next regular meeting will be on November 12th in the small hall at 7:30 p.m. These meetings are always on the second Monday of the month.

RECIPES OF THE MONTH

Brown Rice 'n' Apple Stuffed Turkey

1 can (14-1/2 oz.) chicken broth
 1/2 cup unsweetened apple juice
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1 cup uncooked long grain brown rice
 1/3 cup raisins
 1/2 cup chopped celery
 1/2 cup chopped onion
 1 tablespoon butter
 1 cup chopped tart apple
 1 teaspoon poultry seasoning
 1/4 teaspoon pepper
 1 turkey (10 to 12 pounds)

In a saucepan, combine the broth, 1/3 cup apple juice and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Bring to a boil. Stir in the rice and raisins. Return to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 40-50 minutes or until rice is tender.

Meanwhile, in a nonstick skillet, cook celery and onion in butter for 2 minutes. Add apple; cook and stir for 3 minutes or until vegetables are tender. Combine the rice mixture, apple mixture, poultry seasoning, pepper and remaining apple juice and salt.

Just before baking, loosely stuff turkey. Skewer turkey openings; tie drumsticks together. Place breast side up on a rack in a roasting pan. Bake, uncovered, at 325 degrees for 2-3/4 to 3 hours or until meat thermometer reads 180 degrees for the turkey and 165 degrees for the stuffing. (Cover loosely with foil if turkey browns too quickly.)

Cover turkey and let stand for 20 minutes. Remove stuffing and carve turkey, discarding skin. If desired, thicken pan drippings for gravy.

Corn Bread Dressing

1 cup all-purpose flour
 1 cup cornmeal
 2 tablespoons sugar
 1 tablespoon baking powder
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 2/3 cup water
 1/3 cup fat-free milk
 1 4/ cup egg substitute
 2 tablespoons canola oil
 Dressing:
 10 slices bread, toasted and cubed
 3 cups chopped celery
 1-1/3 cups chopped onion
 1 teaspoon canola oil
 3 teaspoons reduced-sodium chicken or vegetable bullion granules
 1/4 cups boiling water
 1 can (14-1/2 oz) Chicken or vegetable broth
 1/2 cup egg substitute
 2 teaspoons dried parsley flakes
 1-1/2 teaspoons rubbed sage
 1 teaspoon each poultry seasoning, dried basil and rosemary, crushed
 1/2 teaspoon each salt and dried thyme

For cornbread, in a bowl, combine the flour, cornmeal, sugar, baking powder and salt. In a small bowl, combine the water, milk, egg substitute and oil. Stir into flour mixture just until blended. Transfer to an 8-in. square-baking dish coated with nonstick cooking spray. Bake at 375 degrees for 15-20 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool and crumble into a large bowl.

For stuffing, stir bread cubes into corn bread crumbs. In a nonstick skillet coated with non stick cooking spray, cook celery and onion in oil for about 6 minutes or until tender. Stir into corn bread mixture. In a

small bowl, dissolve bouillon in water. In a large bowl, combine the broth, egg substitute, seasonings and bouillon mixture. Pour over corn bread mixture; toss to coat evenly.

Transfer to a 13-in x 9-in. x 2-in. baking pan coated with nonstick cooking spray. Cover and bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes. Uncover; bake 25-30 minutes longer or until lightly browned.

Sour Cream Potatoes

2-1/2 pounds potatoes, peeled and cubed
 3-1/2 cups (14 oz.) shredded cheddar cheese, divided
 2 cups (16 oz.) sour cream
 1 can (10-3/4 oz.) condensed cream of celery soup, undiluted
 1/4 cup butter
 1/4 cup minced chives, divided

Place potatoes in a saucepan; cover with water. Cover and bring to a boil; cook until just tender, about 5 minutes. Drain well. In a bowl, combine 3 cups cheese, sour cream, soup, butter and 3 tablespoons chives. Add potatoes; stir gently until potatoes are coated.

Transfer to a greased 2-1/2-qt. baking dish. Cover and bake at 350 degrees for 35-40 minutes or until heated through. Sprinkle with remaining cheese; bake 2-3 minutes longer or until cheese is melted. Sprinkle with remaining chives.

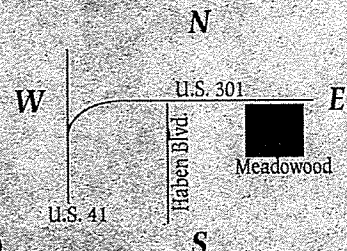

RECIPES OF THE MONTH

Pumpkin Cheesecake Dessert

32 gingersnap cookies, crushed (about 1-1/2 cups)
 1/4 cup butter, melted
 5 packages (8 oz. each) cream cheese, softened
 1 cup sugar
 1 can (15 oz.) solid-packed pumpkin
 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
 5 eggs, lightly beaten
 Dash ground nutmeg
 Maple syrup

In a small bowl, combine the gingersnap crumbs and butter. Press into a greased 13-in. x 9-in. x 2-in. baking dish; set aside.

In a large mixing bowl, beat the cream cheese and sugar until smooth. Beat in the pumpkin, cinnamon and vanilla. Add eggs; beat on low speed just until combined. Pour over crust; sprinkle with nutmeg.

Bake at 350 degrees for 40-45 minutes or until center is almost set. Cool on a wire rack for 10 minutes. Carefully run a knife around edge of baking dish to loosen; cool 1 hour longer. Refrigerate overnight.

Cut into squares; serve with syrup. Refrigerate leftovers.

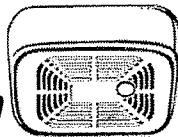
