

From The Chairman

More great news! And it is thanks to many of you. We have surpassed our goal of raising money which was needed for this fiscal year, 2009-2010, and we have almost \$750,000 which will help us as we head next year. We are grateful to all of you who participated in our promissory note program. This will help keep our assessment at a reasonable level as we repay these notes over a 3-year period.

Many of you are aware of the update regarding the lawsuit against the District and four individual Trustees, involving allegations of Sunshine Law and Public Records Law violations— At the most recent court hearing, requesting a motion for partial summary judgment, the judge ruled in favor of the District on some of the allegations. Those allegations are then removed from the lawsuit and the District won't need to defend itself on those during trial. We will continue to move forward in this matter, doing the best for the District.

Another update involves the date of trial—Due to a serious medical condition of our lead litigator, the District asked for a continuance. The court agreed and has placed this case on the only major docket left in 2010, which is October. We don't know exactly on what day the trial will begin but will keep you updated as we become aware of the schedule.

Looking forward to next year—there will be five openings on the Board. We are looking for property owners to consider running. Don't forget to stop in at the Manatee County Supervisor of Elections Office to get your materials. His office is located at 600 301 Blvd. W, Suite 108, here in Bradenton, (941) 741-3823.

C.E.R.T.

(COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM)

The emphasis for C.E.R.T. for February was communication. The E.O.C. and A.R.E.S. have been holding drills for H.A.M. Radio operators. Our C.E.R.T. members have been participating in these drills. Our C.E.R.T. members on the ground in the Park use two-way radios to communicate with our Control Center (H.A.M. Radio Operators). Our Control Center communicates with A.R.E.S. (Amateur Radio Emergency Services) who, in turn, communicates with the county E.O.C. It is important that everyone understands his/her role in the communications. The two way radio operators communicate only with our Central Control, keeping messages short, and never communicating directly with each other. All directives must come from Central Control in order to get the needed help in the right place and by priority.

Emergency means that there is a personal injury that may be life threatening. Priority means that there is a personal injury that is not life threatening but needs attention. Routine means that we have no personal situations. Example: tree down, need water etc;

Judy Riedel gave us an overview of medical emergencies and what authority and training we have to handle those situations. C.E.R.T. must help as many residents as possible. We are not allowed to do CPR or other such medical procedures. First Aide is our only training. Identifying emergencies and getting help is our primary function.

COUNTY COMMISSION CANDIDATES FORUM

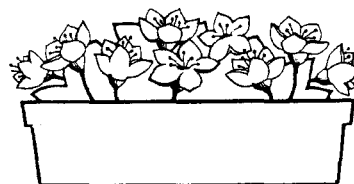

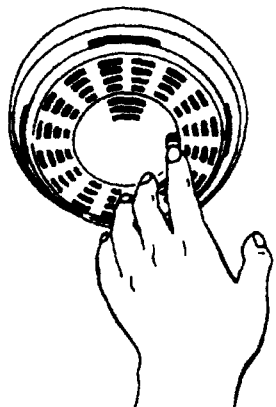

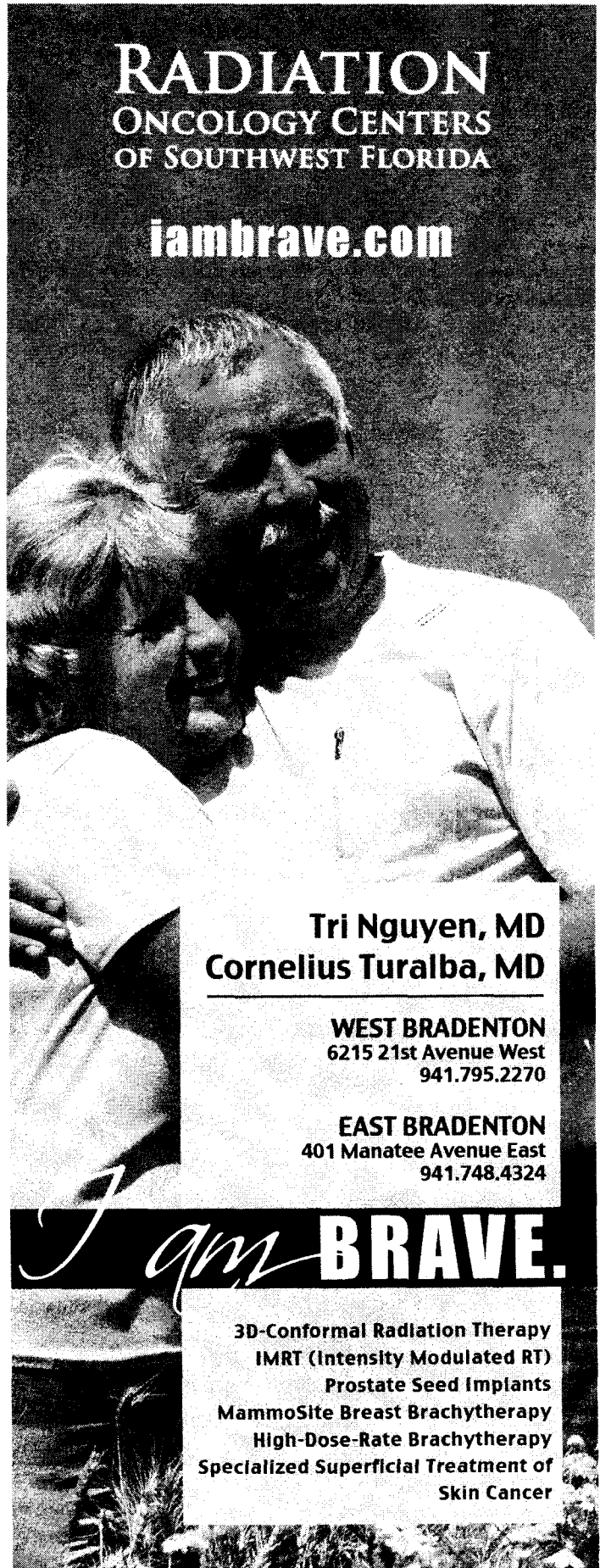

Chief's Corner

INSTALL YOUR SMOKE ALARMS CORRECTLY

- Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, including the basement. Make sure there is an alarm in or near every sleeping area.
- Mount the smoke alarms high on walls or ceilings—remember, smoke rises. Ceiling-mounted alarms should be installed at least four inches away from the nearest wall; wall-mounted alarms should be installed four to 12 inches away from the ceiling.
- If you have ceilings that are pitched, install the alarm near the ceiling's highest point.
- Don't install smoke alarms near windows, doors, or ducts where drafts might interfere with their operation.
- Hard-wired smoke alarms operate on your household electrical current. They can be interconnected so that every alarm sounds regardless of the fire's location. This is an advantage in early warning, because it gives occupants extra time to escape if they are in one part of the home and a fire breaks out in another part. Alarms that are hard-wired should have battery backups in case of a power outage and should be installed by a qualified electrician.
- Don't paint your smoke alarms; paint, stickers or other decorations could keep them from working properly.

KEEP YOUR SMOKE ALARMS WORKING PROPERLY

- Test your smoke alarms at least once a month; follow the manufacturer's instructions.
- Replace the batteries in your smoke alarm once a year or as soon as the alarm "chips", warning that the battery is low. HINT: schedule battery replacements for the same day you change your clock from daylight to standard time in the fall.
- Never "borrow" a battery from a smoke alarm. Smoke alarms can't warn you of fire if their batteries are missing or have been disconnected.
- Don't disable smoke alarms even temporarily—you may forget to replace the battery. If your smoke alarm is sounding "nuisance alarms," it may need dusting or vacuuming. If that doesn't work, try relocation if further away from kitchens and bathrooms, where cooking fumes and steam can cause the alarm to sound.
- Regularly vacuuming or dusting your smoke alarms following manufacturer's instructions can help keep it working properly.
- Smoke alarms don't last forever. Replace your smoke alarms once every 10 years.
- Make sure that everyone in your home can identify and awaken to the sound of the alarm.
- Plan regular fire drills (twice a year is best) to ensure that everyone knows exactly what to do when the smoke alarm sounds. Hold a drill at night to make sure that sleeping family members awaken at the sound of the alarm.

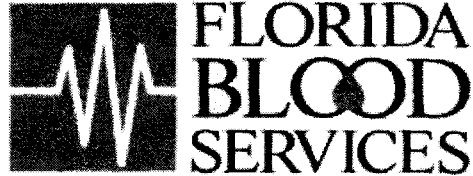
