The Office of Attorney General Bill McCollum has received a request from Toni Gaeta that this office mediate her public records request to the Trailer Estates Park & Recreation District. Ms. Gaeta has requested copies of two documents concerning the request for use of a hall written in August, 2009. A copy of her correspondence is enclosed for your review.

The open government mediation program located in the Attorney General's Office is established in section 16.60, Florida Statutes, to serve as an alternative for resolution of ongoing disputes over access. The program is voluntary and all sides must agree to consider mediation if the program is to be initiated.
